### Book Club Questions:

1. How does this story fit (or not) with your prior experience and/or knowledge of Indigenous traditions of shapeshifting, interdimensionality and the differently alive (ie, zabeah/sasquatch, grandmother spirits, etc)?
2. What character(s) did you most identify with, and why?
3. *Humane's* Amiskwacyi exists in a time/space slightly different than present-day Edmonton: what aspects of Amiskwacyi made most sense to you as within the realm of possibility? What left you with questions?
4. Which death(s) do you find most mournful? Are there some which feel like justice to you?
5. What was your favourite moment in this book?
6. Was there any character which really stood out to you, for good reasons or bad?
7. How would you answer these 2 questions: What does it mean to be Human? What does it matter to be Humane? Has this book changed your perspective on these questions?
