In the year 2000, Mowafa visited his family's homeland of Palestine. It was the beginning of the Second Intifada and Mowafa witnessed first-hand the effects of prolonged conflict and occupation. It was those observations and that experience that inspired him not only to tell his story but to realize many of the intergenerational and colonial traumas that he shares with the Indigenous people of Turtle Island.

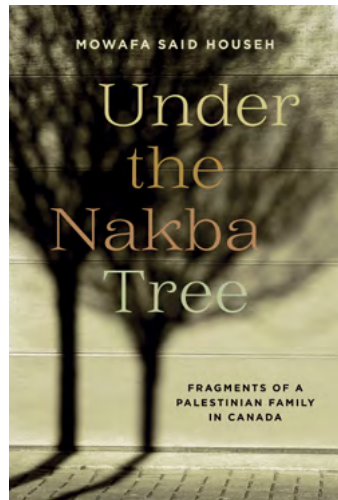
World Bolshevism

Beginning in 1903, the Russian Social Democratic Labour Party was divided into opposing sections, one led by Vladimir Lenin, the other by Iulii Martov. Until 1917, both Lenin and Martov were equally prominent figures in Russian politics. Martov, an anti-war socialist intellectual from a Jewish background, wrote prolifically for a number of important publications inside and outside Russia. Although the books, articles, and pamphlets written by Lenin during the same period remain readily available today, those by Martov are extremely hard to find in their original Russian or in translation.

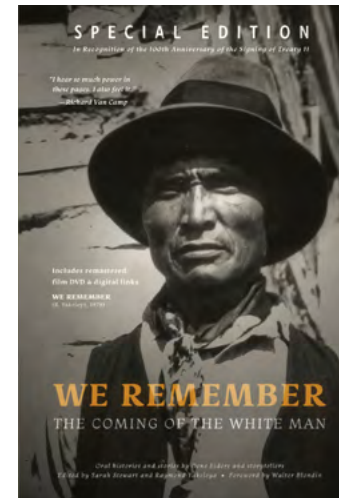
Stories of Métis Women: Tales My Kookum Told Me

The remastered film *We Remember* (1975) is included with the book, on DVD and as digital Vimeo links. As well as poignant essays on Treaty 11, the book includes transcripts of oral histories by Elders. They talk about the early days of fur trading and guns; the flu pandemic; and dismay about the way oil and uranium discoveries and pipelines were handled on their land.

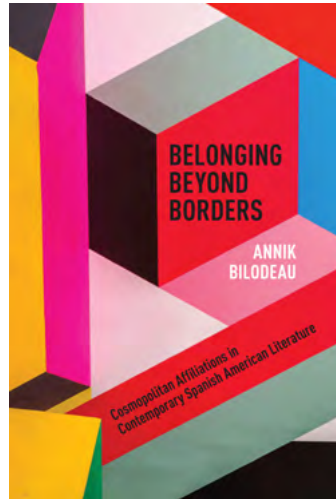
You Look Good for Your Age: An Anthology

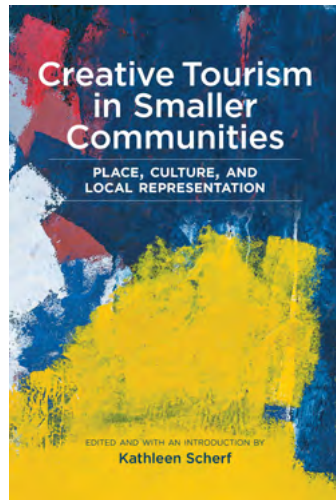
Belonging Beyond Borders: Cosmopolitan Affiliations in Contemporary Spanish American Literature

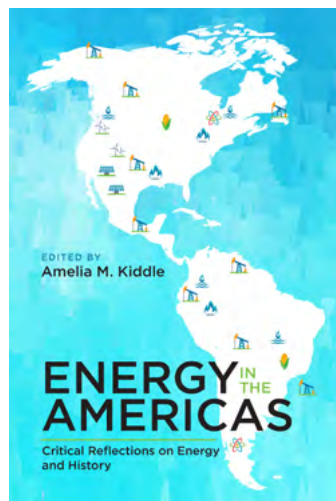

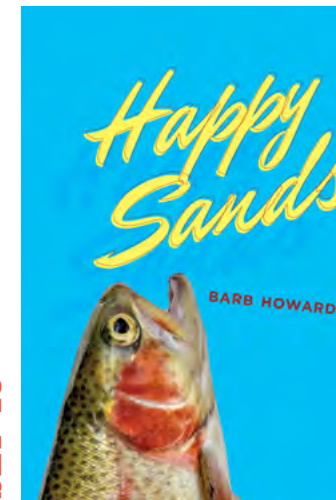
Greatest Garden: The Paintings of David More

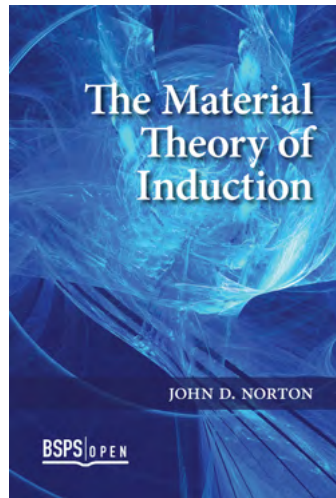

The Material Theory of Induction

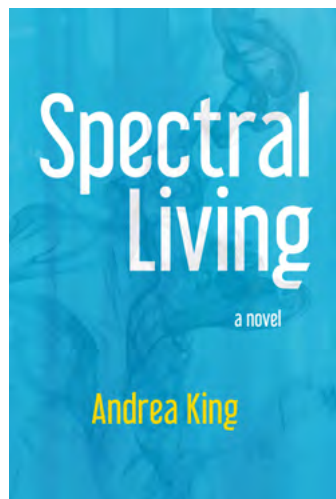

The fundamental burden of a theory of inductive inference is to determine which inductive inferences are good, and why they are so. The traditional approach seeks universally applicable schemas or a single formal device. Yet this approach has not been unequivocally successful.

The Material Theory of Induction argues against the assumption that inductive inference can be accommodated in a single, universal account. It proposes that each domain has an inductive logic determined by the prevailing facts of that domain. 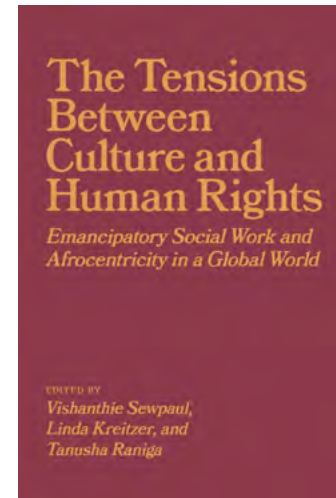

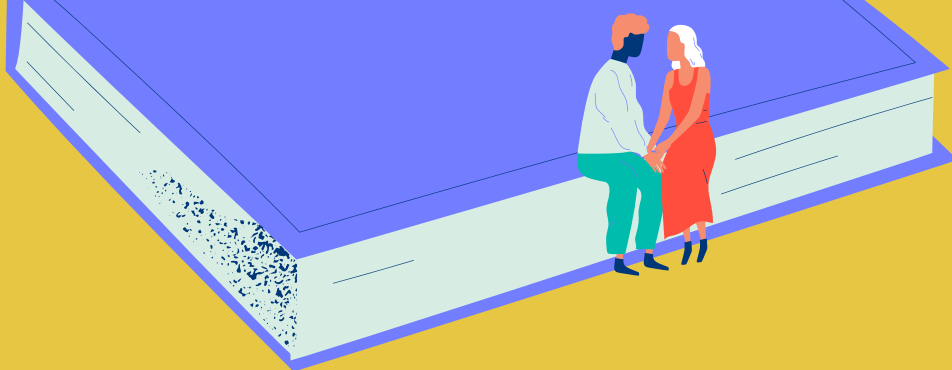
